Participant Financial Obligations

Program Purchased Uniforms

The following items are provided by Marquette High School. These items will be issued prior to cheer camp. These items must be returned prior to tryouts for the next school year. The cheerleader is responsible for the care of each item issued. Any alterations must be approved by a coach IN ADVANCE. If an item is not returned or it is damaged, the cheerleader is responsible for the expense of replacing the item. Families are responsible for dry cleaning program-owned uniforms at the end of the season.

NOTE: Some of these items may be available for resale for a lower price. It is encouraged that all new members to the program look for items in the resale shop before purchasing brand new items. Exact pricing will be available prior to the MANDATORY uniform fitting on April 8th. If a cheerleader previously purchased an item and still has the item in good condition, one does not need to purchase a duplicate item (ex – jacket, pants, and bag). Camp clothing is required for all cheerleaders, even those who do not attend camp. Items are worn for games, practices, fundraisers, school events, etc. Shoes and camp wear are purchased yearly. T-shirts and other spirit wear for various activities are also purchased throughout the year and are not always mandatory.

Camp Costs

UCA Stunt Clinic- May 27th - **Payment due April 22nd- \$50**

UCA Camp - June 24th-27th - UCA Camp - Approx. \$450-\$550

Payment due by as soon as possible OR June 1st at the latest

Additional Costs

- Summer UCA Cheer Camp – Approximately \$450.00 – \$550.00 per cheerleader. If a cheerleader commits to attending camp and then does not attend, the cheerleader **IS** still required to pay for camp. Camp clothing is required for all cheerleaders, even those who do not attend camp. Items are worn for games, practices, fundraisers, school events, etc.
- Local Competition – Approximately \$50.00 per cheerleader plus transportation and/or lodging. Rockwood will **not** offer any financial support for the Competition. However, there will be multiple fundraising opportunities to help offset the costs for families. The decision for the Varsity Team and JV Team to compete in Competitions will be considered annually by the coaching staff and administration.
- **Cheer Program Fundraising** – All cheerleaders are **required to participate in fundraising** that will benefit the Marquette Cheer Program. This includes, but is not limited to, volunteering at the summer MHS Cheer Kids Camp, Trivia Night, Winter Camp, and Color Out sales. If a cheerleader fulfills their fundraising responsibility, they are not required to pay any “activity” fees.
- The MHS Cheerleading Booster Club (BC) supports many aspects of the cheer program under the advisement of the coaching staff. This is accomplished through fundraising. Every cheer family is expected to meet a minimum fundraising commitment at the Parent/Cheerleader Meeting. A variety of individual fundraisers, as determined by the BC Executive Board, will be offered to offset costs for families. The estimated 2026 - 2027 Activity Fee will be \$250 per cheerleader. Complete details, including the 2026 - 2027 budget and fundraising report, will be presented at the 1st parent meeting. In addition, **all families are required to assist in large BC fundraising events as well**. This includes, but is not limited to, **selling a table at the Cheer Trivia Night, gathering donations**, etc. If the Booster Club votes to forgo a large fundraising event, families will be expected to honor their Fundraising Commitment of approximately \$250 per cheerleader in addition to the Activity Fee. Parent Booster Club meetings will generally be held on the second Wednesdays of the month at 6pm.
